# RSET institutes forge ahead despite the pandemic

Dear Reader,

Warm Greetings for the New Year!

The worldwide Pandemic of Corona Virus has posed new challenges for all stake holders in the society. We at the education sector are moving forward gradually and taking steps as per the rules and guidelines declared by the Government from time to time for admission, teaching, evaluation methods as well as conduction of various extra-curricular activities to make the academic environment conducive for students without their physical presence in the campus.

The COVID-19 induced lockdown affected classroom teaching and assessment methodologies. However, this gap was rapidly filled by elearning as schools, colleges and educational institutions were quick to shift teaching and learning through online platform. We at Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust (RSET) also opted quickly for virtual coaching platforms by giving suitable training to the teachers through IT Department. Side by side our institutions also organized many extracurricular activities through online mode.

Regular lectures were conducted on the Google Meet Platform by all institutions in the months of October and November. Colleges affiliated to Mumbai University successfully conducted regular, additional and ATKT exams in December using the online examination application - Eklavya. Online Examination training session for schools was given by Shri Ashish Dutta of GOLD Academy.

Our schools have made us feel proud by their high ranking as per the Times School Survey 2020. Mainadevi Bajaj International School (MBIS) has been ranked 1st in Zone D and 5th in Mumbai among schools with international curriculum as per Times School Survey 2020. MBIS was among the first schools in India to begin online learning for its students when educational institutions closed down in March 2020 . Throughout the year, the school carried out a campaign to collect food for the needy. This project, which is part of the UN's Zero Hunger millennium development goal, was organised in collaboration with Mumbai Roti Bank. It was heartening to see the amount of food grains and other provisions that the students of MBIS from Nursery to Grade 12 managed to collect despite the restrictions.

Other schools of RSET also excelled in academics as well as extracurricular activities. Ramniwas Bajaj English High School ranked 5th in Zone D and 21st in Mumbai for Top schools with National Curriculum and Kudilal Govindram Seksaria English School ranked as 8th Best School with State Board Curriculum in Mumbai as per Times School Survey 2020. Rammniwas Bajaj English High School has been a member of EUMIND (Europe meets India) from the academic year 2018-19. Since then, every year a group of students of the school participated in preparing international projects with some European school and interacted with them on Skype. The students involved in the projects have been awarded Certificate of Excellence for the past two years by the International Jury who assessed the projects.

I am pleased to state that we have started Nalini Shah Music Academy (NSMA) from this academic year which is running successfully with

online vocal and instrumental music classes. NSMA is affiliated to Bharatiya Sangeet Vidya Vihar (BSVV), Kolkata and Pracheen Kala Kendra (PKK), Chandigarh for Hindustani Classical vocal and instrumental music. Bina Shah for their handsome donations to start the Music Academy.

## Lockdown brings variety to learning at RSET

Warm Greetings for the Year 2021.

Nothing great can be achieved by any individual without enthusiasm and interest. To generate enthusiasm, one requires deep interest, involvement, dedication and commitment towards whatever one is doing and whatever one wishes to achieve. With great devotion, dedication and enthusiasm, we at Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust have embarked on the journey of our educational endeavors. We have faced many challenges and impediments, but have been successful in imparting quality education from Pre-School to Post Graduation, specially in Management and Media Studies.

Continuous lockdown of educational institutions right from middle of March,2020 till date has been real challenge for the Management and institutions. However, with the help of IT Department of RSET, teachers were given training, as early as in last week of March, 2020 to start teaching process online. In the academic year 2020-21, our institutions continued all the activities through online platform that included admissions, teaching, examinations and conduction of extra-curricular activities.

Kunjbihari S. Goyal Online Academy (GOLD Academy) conducted subjective and MCQ type Online Tests for ATKT and mid-term internal exams for the students of Deviprasad Goenka Management College of Media Studies(DGMC) and Durgadevi Saraf Institute of Management Studies (DSIMS) on its Learning Management System (LMS). A total number of 39 online examinations were conducted successfully by GOLD Academy between October and December, 2020. The faculty of Ghanshyamdas Saraf College (GSCC) of B.Com and Self-Financed courses successfully held regular, additional and ATKT examinations for F.Y., S.Y., T.Y. & M.Com students in December, 2020 using online examination application – 'Eklavya'.

Lockdown period was also utilized by many universities and institutions for offering free online courses. Students of FY B.Com of Ghanshyamdas Saraf College completed online course on 'Body Language', 'A Key to Professional Success' and 'Developing Soft Skills and Personality' offered by IIT Roorkee and IIT Kanpur respectively as a part of SWAYAM - an initiative of Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India. DSIMS also offered 744 online 'Coursera Courses' free of cost to all students and faculty across the world. Total 197 students were enrolled in these courses and were successfully completed with different specializations to make best of the Pandemic situation.

To celebrate 150th Birth Anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi - Father of the Nation, all the institutions organized various events in the month of October. DGMC held a series of events under the theme 'Gandhi - Then and Now'. A Tree Plantation Drive was organized by NSS volunteers of GSCC between 2nd to 9th October, 2020. Rotaract Club members of GSCC carried out a cleanliness drive on Silver Beach, Madh Island on the occasion of Gandhi Jayanti. The NSS volunteers of Ladhidevi Ramdhar Maheshwari Night College of Commerce participated in a webinar organized by NSS Department of University of Mumbai to celebrate Gandhi Jayanti.

Although there was complete lockdown in the campus, students of



Bafna Junior College of Arts and Commerce and Shri M.D. Shah Mahila College of Arts and Commerce on 20th December, 2020 and won many prizes in various categories such as Push-ups, Sit-ups, Squats and Plank. Prabodhan Krida Bhavan organized Avengers Champions Kho-Kho Trophy competition from 22nd December to 25th December, 2020 in which students of DSJC won gold and silver medals. Some students participated in Skipping and Chess competition and received participation certificates.

The lockdown period was also utilised by students of some institutions for outreach programmes. Under Project Sahyog, DSIMS and DSGS started a fundraising camp for "Mumbai Dabbavalas" to provide "Dry Ration kits" to support Dabbavalas family. The teachers of RBHS celebrated Christmas in a unique way by donating for providing meals to 50 elderly people under the 'Meals to Heal [Annadaanam]' programme in association with IDF. ## Quality online learning at RSET

The months of October, November and December 2020 were filled with lot of happenings and we at RSET were busy in planning, coordinating and executing all the academic activities of the institutions from KG to PG. Acceptance of online education is growing as new e-Learning trend. We have seen more student engagement and collaboration during this quarter which has resulted in personalisation of learning. There are distinct advantages of the online T-L process which have been exploited by us to maximum extent and has benefitted the students most. The activities of the RSET have been covered under the following heads:-

#### Academics

In addition to the non-teaching staff, the teaching staff too resumed working from our Schools and Colleges, effective 1 st week of October, as per the laid down policies of the Education Board/Govt of Maharashtra/Mumbai University etc. Lectures for students were conducted on online platform from our Campus. Each school/College/Institute have kept a detailed record of the online lectures taken by the teachers. There were large number of International and National Webinars which have benefitted in enhancing the knowledge amongst the students. The first Eumind [Europe meets India] VC with the Netherland School, Berlage Lyceum was held in December wherein the students discussed various aspects of their project Go Green.

## **Examinations**

We at RSET have successfully conducted regular and additional examinations for various streams using the online examination modules. Both, our GOLD Academy and the IT Team has been instrumental in  $conducting \ these \ exams \ smoothly \ and \ flawlessly. \ One \ of \ our \ college \ was$ the main centre to conduct the H.S.C. Board Examination (Science) and

was allotted 188 students. College successfully organized the board examinations for Science faculty.

#### **Admissions**

We at RSET are very happy to share with our readers that all our schools and colleges are in great demand and our admissions are full. Due to Pandemic, though the fresh admissions in both the Hostels (Bovs' Hostel and Women's Hostel) is a bit of challenge our existing hostel students are renewing their admissions.

#### NCC/NSS/Rotaract Club

The volunteers of the NCC, NSS and Rotaract Club were kept engaged in plethora of virtual activities like attending quiz competitions, taking pledge on Rashtriya Ekata Diwas, helping underprivileged students, awareness programme on "World mental health day", active participation in "Best out of Waste" initiative, attending webinars and lectures related with the respective fields and all training related activities. They have taken part in real time activities also, like cleanliness drive on Silver Beach, Madh Island. Soft Skill development was also undertaken for these students.

#### Parent Teacher Meetings

Detailed Information regarding all the academic activities were also discussed. Though the Pandemic may have dampened the festive vibes there was no let go in keeping the spirits high through virtual means. The Navratri, "Raas Garba and Diwali Celebrations were organised on various digital media including You Tube. Our talented students took part in games and competitions and demonstrated their "Josh" to the fullest extent. To motivate them the prizes were awarded in different categories of the competitions.

#### Sports

In normal times, our Sports Academy (PDSA) which is located inside the RSET Campus, offers various sports facilities like Tennis, Basketball, Boxcricket, Football, Volleyball etc. Due to continuous lockdown of educational institutions, we were unable to utilise this resource fully. # Message From Director of Schools

# Cultivating a meditative mind in the pandemic

While nurturing our minds and bodies has been a theme in eastern thought over the millennia and many practice it even today, in this time of pandemic, when maintaining equanimity has been a challenge to the young and the old, this aspect of our ancient learning has assumed a great significance. If we look at the statistics pertaining to mental illnesses, suicides, divorces and abuse during this period we can see a staggering increase over the past years. And given this sad addition to the destruction caused by the pandemic itself, it is not surprising that spiritual gurus, yoga teachers and classes as well as psychiatrists are having a very busy time. It is a minor aside that they are also making a lot of money.

The point to be rued under this circumstance is the manner in which the human mind tends towards these options only when faced with a crisis. But the problem with this approach is that by the time we have hit the age of around 35 years, our bodies are so hard wired and programmed to habit that breaking out of it and exploring something new becomes not only challenging but also scary. Dr Joe Dispenza, the proponent of Impact Theory, highlights this point by saying that when 95 per cent of your body is hard-wired to all the experiences you have had by the age of 35, and then when 5 per cent of your mind and body tries to turn it around, you have a serious problem. That is because first we have to unlearn what we have learnt to be able to begin anew. Rabindranath Tagore spoke of `the dreary sand of dead habit' that makes change challenging and that makes us repeatedly do the same thing till we are dead, unable to introduce any newness in our lives.

So what is it that prevents us from looking at the obvious mental and physical damage that we have been doing to our bodies till we are faced with a crisis? Even if we live in this crowded metropolis, having been born and brought up in the tropics, all of us have some understanding of plant life. We know that when that pot containing the marigold plant becomes crowded with roots, when the soil looses it fertility and when the plant can no longer breath freely, it will surely stop flowering at first and then wither and die. Much before this happens we know that it is time to rejuvenate the plant. It is time to aerate it, to fertilize it and, at times, even to uproot it, reduce the jungle of roots and to transplant it.

When this basic understanding of how plant life works is clear in our minds, why are we unable to transplant this knowledge and apply it to ourselves? Over our lifetime we contaminate our body with polluted air, and sometimes this is circumstantial and we cannot help it. But surely we can do something about the food we eat, its quality and quantity? And what about the slothful living habits due to which we are unable to do adequate amount of exercise? When genetics came into being and became the buzz-word of scientific talk, it was suggested that you have little control over what becomes of your body and that this is determined by genes and inheritance. Over the years this premise has been revised and now it is recognized that if you acquire a bodily malady, genetics contributes to only 3 per cent of such cases and up to 97 per cent of the cause is the manner in which we have lived our lives.

In the present context, what has become more important than paying attention to the body is what we do with our minds. Our minds are so jam





packed with thoughts and we are adding more to these thoughts every day. The electronic media that includes mobiles, laptops and television make sure that we are not left with a single waking moment of peace and quiet. Research indicates that we get up to 75,000 thoughts per day. And, surprisingly, almost all these thoughts are the same as the ones you got the previous day. Look at the thoughts that you get as soon as you are awake and funnily enough you will find that most of them, on a normal day, are the same as the day before and the days before that. Unfortunately these thoughts, many of them to do with triggering off the stress hormones in our bodies, are not harmless entities. They trigger off emotions often to do with anxiety, worry, pain, competition, envy and jealousy and affect us deeply.

So what is the response to worries over an unhealthy body that may fall prey to some flu or the other and a mind that is suffused with thoughts that cause mental suffering? At Sahyadri school, which is a residential school located outside Pune, each evening the entire school community climbs the meditation hill. No one speaks for a period of time. In that silence they seek the slowing down of their minds and bodies. This is what meditation means to me. It is a time to know yourself. To get in touch with your body and your mind and see the processes that are affecting them. What your mind does with the sensory stimulus it receives from the environment is called cognition. And when you observe this process of how your mind works and understand it, you are entering the field of metacognition.


This pandemic has given us some time to hit the pause button. It is time to meditate.



#### GC and CDC Meeting held on Saturday 7th Nov 2020

The Governing Council (GC) College Development Committee (CDC) meeting was held at DSIMS's VC room 621 on 7 November 2020. The members who were unable to be present at the meeting due to the pandemic, attended the meeting virtually via Zoom.

Chairman RSET Shri Ashokji Saraf made the opening remarks and welcomed all the honourable trustees and staff members. Minutes of the previous meeting was read to those present and all the attendees confirmed what had been said. DGMC Principal Dr Amee Vora eloquently presented all the activities that had been undertaken at the college and also presented its academic report from 15 March to 31 October 2020.

Dr Vora mentioned a host of webinars and extra-curricular activities that had been undertaken by the students and the staff in order to enrich pedagogy. She sought permission to begin NSS and institute a Rotoract Club at the college. Dr Vora then informed the trustees about the introduction of the add-on courses and the initiative of the newly instituted Training & Placement Cell. Attributing the low rate of admissions this term in the postgraduate courses and the PGDM to the COVID-19 pandemic, she explained the importance of marketing.

Dr Vora also stated her case for updating the college equipment through the IQAC, seeking help and support from all the trustees.

#### **ATTENDANCE**

DGMC has been following the Ordinance 6086 which lays down the norms of Attendance for a learner very strictly. It ensure that attendance is recorded every lecture by the faculty and is submitted to the attendance committee by the end of the day. The attendance thus recorded is complied every month by the said admin staff looking after attendance. This attendance is displayed between the 5th and 7th of every following month where a learner was able to check the average overall attendance recorded. All learners recording an attendance below 75% were sent a letter of warning of the shortage and asking him/her to make up the said loss.

The letter was sent every month and a parent student defaulter meet was held on 30th November for SY and TY classes and for FY classes on 5th December to warn the parent and the ward of the shortfall and of the consequence thereof if the required attendance is not met by the learner. The Committee went through all the cases and prepared a Disposal of Appeals which was sent to the University with the Final List of students who are detained and has debarred from appearing from the forth coming Semester End Examination commencing from 16th December 2020. The total number of students who were detained and were not allowed to appear for the Examinations of Semester I, III and V across all classes of FY/SY/TY BAMMC/BMM and BAFTNMP was 73.

#### PGDM Live Project from 1st to 14th Dec 2020

In the current circumstances, when there is a visible gap in demand and supply of qualified professionals in the industry, live projects can act as adhesives to bridge the gap. Providing a hands-on experience about the market scenario and corporate life, live projects act as a platform where students can get their real-time work experience.

In view of this, a 16 day period, commencing from 1st Dec to 16th December 2020 had been identified as a period of Live Project, for PGDM Second Year students, batch 2019 -2021. The aim was to provide a virtual mentor who would overlook a live project of PGDM students, and provide their valuable feedback. This would also act as a testing ground for the said students to evaluate his/her mass media knowledge and prowess in areas of Production, Branding, Digital, Content writing and Media Planning.







We had an entire week of Christmas carnival from 14th December 2020. Tiny tots were introduced to the Christmas tree, Santa Claus, and Snowman.



Year 2020 threw in many challenges for all individuals in varied shapes and sizes. This led to newer innovations and opportunities and at the same time caused stress and anxiety. To assist individuals to deal with these emotions RMCC had organized a webinar on "Unlocking Stress and Anxiety" which focussed on importance of mental health.

The webinar was facilitated by Dr. Avinash Desousa. He informed the participants about the importance of taking care of mental health and pointed out various emotional concerns that people are facing due to lockdown especially the unhealthy negative concerns like stress and anxiety. He shared various signs and symptoms of stress and anxiety which have escalated during the Covid 19 lockdown and how restrictions

in people's mobility and socialization have impacted their state of mind. RMCC received an overwhelming response from the participants and the session was very interactive throughout. The participants shared their plight and concerns which they have been experiencing and they were duly addressed by Dr. De' Sousa. Myths with respect to mental wellness and concerns regarding approaching a professional were clarified by the speaker.

RMCC conducted a webinar on A Roadmap to reading strategies for children held on 31st October, 2020 to help parents to look at the red flags of children showing difficulties in reading skills, and what are the simple strategies the parents can use to help their child read at home.

Owing to the pandemic and the increase in online teaching, the parents are getting more time with their children. Due to this they are able to observe and see what difficulties their child is facing when they are reading. The session entailed different strategies that the parents could use to build on the reading skills. It also included activities which focused on practicing the different strategies that they learnt during the session so they know how to execute them. These strategies will assist them to make their children smart readers and ensure that their efforts produce results.

RMCC conducted a webinar for **Cyber Safety** for students from the 5th-10th grade on 23rd November, 2020. The objective of conducting the session was to help the students understand the importance of cyber safety and indulge in safer cyberspace practices. This is of utmost importance as children now spend hours online due to online classes being conducted and their usage not being monitored always.

situations. The students were active participants in the discussion and came up with solutions.

On popular demand RMCC conducted a webinar again on "Happy Journaling" in the month of November 2020. The webinar was organized to assist participants in understanding how Journaling as technique can be used to clear the chaotic Thoughts and bring clarity to the thoughts. The webinar was initiated with an open discussion on what is Journaling and what is the difference between Diary writing and Journaling.

The webinar focused on the importance of this technique and how can be used as first aid at a primary stage of emotional distress and to declutter one's thoughts. It was also shared by the professional of why journaling is important and requested the participants to take up an event / situation or emotion that they want to work on. Post which participants were asked to do a mindfulness activity based on breathing technique to calm one's mind before initiating Journaling technique. 
### World's oldest running University:














Jankidevi Bilasrai Bubna Boys' Hostel is an independent building with seven floors and is situated near RSET campus. It has all state of art facilities such as a canteen, air-conditioned study area on all the floors, lounge and TV room, games room etc. All the rooms are air-conditioned. For the safety and security of the students staying in the hostel, suitable fire detection and fire - fighting system have been provided in the building. CCTVs are also installed for 24 x 7 security. There is Wi-Fi access to the entire building. To keep the hostel clean, the house-keeping staff appointed by the Management, clean all the areas at frequent intervals. The Hostel has provision of accommodating 152 students. Adequate Hostel staff have been appointed for maintaining proper administration of the Hostel. 

This Pandemic has been a great teacher for all of us. We teachers will agree that technology is not here to replace us but to enhance our teaching experience so as to help our learners learn better. A teacher without the knowledge of technology can be easily replaced by the one who embraces technology.

When I first started as a teacher, I was considered pretty tech Savvy with respect to my use of power point and making interactive video presentations. Free EdTech tools have the power to empower our learners and help in democratizing education.

The importance of Technology can no longer be undermined especially for us educators, Technology came as a boon to survive this pandemic and connect with our learners.

Before the pandemic many of us were at the mercy of our spouse, children, friends and family to do technology related things. From booking an online ticket, to finding out your favorite restaurant, to doing online shopping to making online payments or to manage our digital needs, many of us always feel fearful and need a helping hand.

Taking a helping hand is totally ok and acceptable but being totally dependent on someone is definitely a BIG problem.

Presently, just like mobile apps, there are educational apps which help make the job of teaching easier than ever, provided one has the knowledge of the right tools to be used and the objective for using them.

Few EdTech tools that every Teacher must try in their virtual classroom are as follows:

Seesaw- is an amazing digital portfolio app that captures student work through the use of photos, videos, and audio. It enables students to showcase their work and collaborate with their peers. This tool is ideal for young learners

**Socrative:** is one of the digital tools for classroom that will help you assess your students and get immediate insight on students' knowledge. At the same time, using Socrative is fun for you and for your students, so basically, they can have fun while taking a test! You can launch various types of assessments and follow the results in real time

Padlet- effectively a digital pin board, was another game-changer in my teaching. I used Padlet in two ways; first, to create an anonymous question board where students pin up virtual sticky notes with questions that both the teacher and other students can respond to, and second, to save articles and web content that I have curated for particular topics.

Mind Mesiter-leads the pack of free mind mapping apps that helps students visualize their thinking. It is mobile friendly and allows students to share maps and build them collaboratively in real-time. Canva is a super-cool drag and drop graphic design tool that is 100% free for teachers and students. Students can play with a huge library of professionally designed infographics and posters to visualize their learning, and for adding a 'wow factor' to their presentations. It's also a super-handy tool for teacher handouts!

Mentimeter- is another app that generates live polls in the form of creative visualisations. It is also a word cloud generator, which is







great for brainstorming sessions and pre-discussion prompts. Very often used in presentations to summaries. You can even try Slido.com as they help to solve similar purpose.

#### **Random Lists**

Random group generators like Random Lists are a godsend when you want to arrange a class into different types of groups— not only do students end up working with different members of the class, but it saves a truckload of time getting students into groups in the first place.

#### Wheel Decide

Spin wheels such as Wheel Decide are another super simple way to gamify learning, either by picking random names to call on class members during group discussions, or to create your own 'Wheel of Fortune' style revision games.

#### Online Stopwatch

Online Stopwatch has a range of fun classroom timers that turn task oriented or any timed activity into a game. Do check this out as there are some really cool online stopwatch to try


