


completed the courses.

# Message From Director of Schools

#### Tech integration leads the way in schools

The Covid Pandemic continues to rage on in its second avatar now. Just as we were beginning to feel a level of comfort that things were returning to normal by the end of 2020, things have taken a turn for the worse. The numbers are larger than during the first wave and the population being affected is not only from among those who are vulnerable. Not only are the poor but those in well-endowed high rise building are also falling prey to the virus. More worrisomely, it is affecting the younger generation too.

In the education sector the effects have been myriad. Online learning has spread far and wide and even students in rural areas have now learned to be glued to their hand held devices and accept the new reality. Physical attendance at educational institutions still remains a far cry and hence this has had an impact on board examinations and all forms of assessments in general. After hedging for a long time, many states have called off or postponed their board examinations and internal examinations have been modified. In Maharashtra, a decision to compulsory promote all students taking school-based examinations has been taken. How this affects the learning of the students and their future prospects remains to be seen.

In this process, one facet of life that has seen what can be considered as a semi-permanent change is the integration of technology into the field of education. There were many sane voices that were opposed to the rapid technological change and some continue to do so. However, such voices have become muted as the new reality settles into our lives. So technological integration into the field of education is now seeing untrammelled growth in many schools, particularly those endowed with resources. In that sense this technological growth has been discriminatory as it sees greater proliferation among those who can pay and those who cannot, such as students from state and municipal boards as well as those from the rural parts of the country, are being left behind.

Integration of technology has assumed such prominence that many schools now have regular sessions to see that their teachers and students are up to the mark with the changes that have been taking place. Some schools have instituted Tech Tuesdays. On this day, teachers share their new learning and display how they integrate technology into their learning. There are coordinators who are charged with the task of ensuring that this learning does not remain only on the workshop level but is actually reflected in teaching practices.

Hence, while lamenting the inequity in the use and reach of technology, one can also take a look at some of the enabling developments that represent innovations that could not have been imagined prior to the pandemic. As usual, Mainadevi Bajaj International School has been at the forefront in implementing tech integration into their classrooms. Every Tuesday and Thursday an hour is set aside where, led by the IT Coordinator, teachers are exposed to new ways in which technology can be used to enhance learning. Two interesting aspects of this initiative are that in the first place it is not the IT coordinator who is the sole presenter of new initiatives. In each session some teacher or the other speaks of how they are using technology in their subject. The second interesting aspect is that each of these sessions also requires the teachers to practice what is being taught while the session is in progress. This leads to the raising of many relevant questions as well as exploration of how that which is pertinent



to Mathematics can also be used by an Art or any other teacher.

While the elaboration of the new technology and its variety will need a much broader forum, it would be pertinent to speak of at least one of the initiatives undertaken at MBIS. The IB Diploma Visual Art course normally ends in an exhibition of the art works of the students who have opted for the subject. This is a major culminating activity and is judged by an external examiner and it is like a regular art show with gallery effects and the use of wide spaces all over the school. This is necessary since each student has several large pieces to display and needs to do up the place, just as in a gallery.

However, such an exhibition would involve Covid social distancing norms defying interactions since students and teachers work in close proximity for weeks before the exhibition. To overcome this problem, our students set up a virtual art exhibition using the tool of Artsteps. After the visitor to this virtual gallery is given access to the exhibition, which is open between given hours and for a given number of days, she can move back and forth through this virtual gallery and read all the details of the students' works. If she wants to take a closer look she can zoom in as much as she likes without the high definition images being distorted. The art teacher taught this technique to rest of the MBIS teachers who are now quite excited about using it to display student works right from the Nursery upwards. This is just one example and every teacher is experimenting with many IT tools and sharing with their colleagues.

So the debate on the proliferation of this new technology and its pros and cons will continue and it is important that we look closely at how it is affecting our mental and physical well-being as well as its economically and socially discriminatory nature. At the same time, we have to recognize its strong presence in our midst and understand it before deciding to accept or resist it.



# Unique solutions for a strange time

Dear Reader,

We celebrated International Education Day on 24th January, 2021. This year's theme reflects our collective global challenge 'to recover and revitalize education for the COVID-19 generation.' The Pandemic has totally disrupted the education sector across the world and especially countries like ours that are marked with inequalities and digital divide. As life was slowly attempting to return to normalcy, the second wave of COVID-19 descended on our country like a tsunami. We have been caught unawares and our response is one of panic and chaos.

Students, who were to appear for board examinations and entrances and other higher level examinations are further distressed in 2021. They have no clarity about the upcoming examinations due to a sudden rise in COVID cases. After national and international educational boards in the country cancelled the class 10 examinations the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education followed the suit and decided not to hold SSC examination that had been rescheduled for June, 2021. It was decided by the Education Department that the students will be marked on a fair and accurate assessment criteria instead of appearing physically for examinations.

While the SSC examinations stands cancelled, the HSC examinations are deferred by the state educational department for a later date leading to utter confusion and uncertainty in the minds of the students. Most of the entrance examinations including JEE Main 2021, have been postponed amid the COVID-19 surge cases across the country. Those appearing for the National Eligibility Cum Entrance Test - undergraduate (NEET-UG) also seem to be worried for want of updates on the medical entrance examinations.

At the entertainment industry front, the most internationally acclaimed 93rd Academy Awards ceremony also

known as Oscar Award took place in Los Angeles, USA, on 25th April, 2021 (for Indian viewers in the early hours of 26th April) in a unique fashion. The attendees comprised of just a few hundred nominees and presenters who gathered in a ballroom and observed social distancing while some contenders joined the festivities by satellite from international locations. In our country, the 66th Film Fare Awards ceremony was held on 27th March, 2021 in Mumbai. The 21st International Indian Film Academy (IIFA) Awards supposed to take place in Indore from March 27 to 29, 2020 were postponed due to COVID-19 Pandemic.


In sports the cricket matches of Indian Premiere League have been postponed indefinitely after a number of positive cases of corona virus were detected among the players and the staff. One of the major reasons behind hosting this year's IPL in India was setting an example for hosting the ICC T20 World Cup in October-November this year. 





#### Conference on Living Gender-The Rationale

The term 'gender' has evolved over the years, surpassing the binary male and female and is now inclusive of a wide spectrum of identities. It intersects with other governing, social, economic and political structures like those of caste, class, ethnicity and race to further create situations of invisibility, discrimination, marginalization, double marginalization, silencing, hybridization, sexism, and disentitlement.

Media studies involve the study of the workings of variedly distributed power within the industry. In this context, a thorough immersion into the ocean of gender discourses beyond the popular disembodied western rationality surrounding the idea of 'gender and power' is an imperative for every student pursuing Media Studies. Deviprasad Goenka Management College of Media Studies, being an educational space that predominantly specializes in offering Media Studies, took up the responsibility of curating a web-conference on gender.

#### Conference on Living Gender-Get the Wheels Rolling

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell of the College meticulously planned and organized a full day international conference titled "Living Gender: Recognition, Repression and Representation". The objective of the conference was to enable the understanding, reflection and ideation of various expressions of the interactions of gender with other social structures and its impact on different sections of the society.

This multidisciplinary conference was proposed with the idea of bringing together people across the spectrum of gender, sexuality, disability,

caste and nationality to create a dialogue around these themes which can lead a way forward for not just academia and pedagogy but also various other platforms such as media, commerce, and management platforms on issues of gender.

The inaugural ceremony commenced with a breathtaking curtain raiser prepared by Prof. Shalu Balan. Ashok Ji Saraf, the chairperson of Rajasthani Sammelan Education Trust addressed the audience giving his best wishes for the success of the event. This was followed by the Principal of DGMC, Dr. Amee Vora's welcome address. Dr. Dilnaz Boga, the head of Internal Quality Assurance Cell presented the rationale of the conference. Mr. Digbijoy Ghosh student of SYBAFTNMP made the announcement regarding three panel discussions that were set to be conducted one after the other throughout the day.

#### Conference on Living Gender - Setting the Tone

The keynote address was delivered by Dr. Deepti Misri, Associate Professor of Women and Gender Studies at the University of Colorado, Bolder. The Keynote address covered questions of gender marginalization in the Kashmir valley, the Hashtag Me Too Campaign pertaining to the Kathua case and celebrity support for the gender cause.

Guest of Honour, Acharya Laxmi Narayan Tripathi addressed the audience. In her speech that showed unflinching courage, highlighted the sorry condition of trans-genders and the oppressive treatment meted out to the trans-community even in this day and age.

The powerful speeches of the two guests at the commencement of the event set the tone for the three huge panels of the web conference.

#### Living Gender-Panel on Recognition Intersectionality

The aim of the first panel discussion "Living Gender through Recognition" was to bring out the complexities of recognizing not just gender identities but also understanding the impact of different other invisibilising structures like caste and disability on gender discourse. The keynote address was given by Dr. Anjali Arondekar's and the panel was moderated by Rajni Palriwala with an unparalleled assertiveness in tone and spirit. Dr. Anita Ghai, Dr. Akkai Padmashali, Dr. Smita Patil, Rishit Neogi and Kalpana Sharma were the panelists.

The panel raised questions on the normalization of state involvement in criminalizing, decriminalizing and recriminalizing bodies and the intersectionality of class, caste and gender. The panel further provided insights on the need to understand gender in the context of cure and care, driving home the message, "We are not broken, so don't fix us."

#### Living Gender-Panel on Recognition: Paper Presentation

A research paper titled "I'm my own boss and I exploit myself" in a patriarchal capitalist system: An exploration into the work of women freelancers in the advertising industry in India, prepared by Kailash Koushik and Nivedita Mahesh and was allowed to be presented by Kailash Koushik as part of recognizing the most meritorious work received in this category. This research paper focused on the oppressive indoctrination of what is termed as hegemonic normal.



## Living Gender – Panel on Repression: Inadequacies of Law and Language

This panel commenced with the keynote address delivered by Urvashi Butalia; with her ornate style of oratory, Urvashi Butalia drew the Zoom room's attention to the fact that the dynamics of law and enforcement is

not able to cope with the veracities connected with gender. The audience could not have agreed more with her when she asserted that ambivalence is part of the question of gender. This panel was Moderated by Laxmi Murthy, and it focused on the lacunae inherent in language and its apparent failure to safeguard intangible questions of identity, nationality and gender. The panel further brought the audience's attention to the inbuilt hierarchies in structures of language, values and media. Pooja Nair, Sameera Khan, Girija Gupte and Aishe Ghosh were the illustrious members of this panel.

#### Living Gender - Panel on Representation: Media Narratives

The last panel "Living Gender through Representation" aimed at raising the pertinent questions of representation of whom and by whom. Ms. Sampath Pal was the keynote speaker. Ms. Pal, with her commanding disposition and loud voice, got the panel floor ready to raise the question of self-determination and absurdity of benevolence in the context of gender. This panel was Moderated by Dr. Shilpa Phadke, the panel focused on questions of privilege in media representation and transnational narratives of gendered bodies. Dr. Aqsa Shaikh, Dr. Meghna Dutta, Dr. Shamim Modi and Sumaira Jajja were the panelists.

This panel boldly highlighted how media narratives have a hierarchy of danger as they over represent violence and crime against women. This panel also raised contentions on how when society claims to be concerned about women's safety, it is not concerned about their actual safety and security but rather it is more concerned about protecting their reputation linked to chastity.

#### Paper Presentation via Google Meet

Paper presentation including discussion on the correlated topics was simultaneously conducted on the Google Meet Platform. Dr. Rajlaxmi Ghosh, Subject Matter Expert from Jadavpur University, Kolkata, a PhD in Women's Studies and a Double Master's Degree in Film Studies and Comparative Literature chaired the paper presentation session that was presented by 7 well-versed participants.

#### Closing Keynote Address

The closing key note was delivered by Dr. Nitasha Kaul, Associate Professor, University of Westminster. In her closing, she highlighted crucial conceptual points related to nature of subjugation, politics, identity, 'relationality' in the contextual pastures of gender studies.

#### Conference on Living Gender - Bidding Adieu

At the end of each panel discussion, a question and answer session was allowed for the attendees to interact with the panelists. Vote of thanks was proposed separately for every individual panel. Queries that appeared on the chat sections were attended to throughout the event.

The conference concluded with an earnest request placed before the audience to share the experiences they would be taking home from the different panels of the conference and make the most of it by bringing about the much needed sensitivity and behavior change in the area of gender comprehension.

A vote of thanks was proposed separately for every individual panel. Queries that appeared on the chat sections were attended to throughout the event. Prof. Selvi delivered an oral summary presentation of the entire conference. After that, Dr. Dilnaz Boga, the head of the Internal Quality Assurance Cell proposed the vote of thanks. Many members from the audience were vocal about how the conference happened to be an enriching experience for them. The conference concluded with an earnest request placed before the audience to share the experiences they would be taking home from the different panels of the conference and make the most of it by bringing about the much needed sensitivity and behavior change in the area of gender comprehension.

**DSIMS and DSGS** organized Seventh Remsons International Research Conference (RIRC) on 27 March 2021 under the aegis of Remsons Centre for Management Research. The Theme of the conference was 'New Normal in Businesses: Readiness and Resilience." Chief Convener of RIRC 2021, Dr. Sumana Chaudhuri welcomed the august gathering and apprised the relevance of the theme.

Following Sri Saraswati Vandana, an invocation to the Goddess of Learning and playing of the DSIMS Anthem, Director DSIMS Dr. C Babu and Director DSGS, Dr. Sarita Vichore ceremonially initiated the opening of the Conference and warmly welcomed the dignitaries and guests on the occasion. DSIMS Director Dr. C Babu expressed his satisfaction of organizing a Conference of this stature and mettle at

trying times. The rise and fall of businesses, the ebbing of business cycles, the spurt in economies found voice and vividness in his address. He illumined the audience from personal anecdotes and learnings during and after the lockdown and narrated that how RSET and her affiliate Institutes and Colleges exhibited extraordinary courage to rise on the occasion, remain grounded to their profession and passion and made a difference in the academia.

In her address, Dr. Sarita Vichore mentioned that businesses in India and across the world has reacted rapidly, reorganizing supply chains, adopting remote-work models, and speeding up decision making with surprising velocity. Vaccines were created with unprecedented swiftness. As with prior crises, the organizations that acted quickly to

The Plenary Session also marked the unveiling of the Vol. 2, Issue 2 and Volume 3 Issue 1 of the Institute Journal "The Management Quest" by RSET Leadership Team. The Proceedings of the Remsons International Research Conference were too formally unveiled in the Conference. Presenting the Remsons Research Centre Report 2021, Dr Sumana Chaudhuri mentioned that under the aegis of RCMR, DSIMS and DSGS conducted over twenty Internal FDPs in emerging areas of business and managerial scholarship. He opinionated that amid inevitable disruptions and exponential changes, the businesses need to scale up their skill sets through innovation and just in time and place interventions. Talking about contingencies like the pandemic, he urged the audience to exercise prudence to face the crisis and emerge victorious.

The distinguished speakers onboard in the Remsons International Research Conference 2021 included an outstanding congregation of leading industry commanders and academic stalwarts across three continents, North America, Europe and Asia.

Professor David E Zepeda from Boston University, Massachusetts, in his opening notes mentioned that COVID-19 pandemic is far more than a health crisis: it is affecting societies and economies at their core. He provided us insights into current U.S. consumer behavior regarding healthcare. In many ways, Professor Zepeda mentioned that consumers in USA are taking charge of their health more than ever before. They are learning about their health risks, communicating with their doctors in new and different ways, and changing their attitudes about data privacy. Each of these factors has a significant influence on how patients are interacting with the health system. He opined that globally, healthcare supply chains are becoming more agile and adaptive while optimizing cost and

decreasing time to market for bringing all citizens under the vaccination fold.

Professor Krishnendu Sarkar, Director, NSHM Knowledge Campus, Kolkata mentioned that the higher education sector saw some fundamental changes during COVID-19 and engagement with all stakeholders was a key attribute to be successful. Many professionals used this time to reskill themselves, opening new opportunities for academic Institutions. New Education policy (NEP 2020) also helped universities with flexible online programmes. Professional courses like engineering and management became more relevant during COVID19, as expressed by Professor Sarkar.

Professor Sachin Kamble from EDHEC Business School, Paris, focused on the Small and Medium Enterprises in European Union and how they have weathered the uncertainties of the pandemic induced slowdown. Professor Kamble, while drawing a comparison between SMEs in India and Europen Union, deliberated that the steps for reopening and reinvention remain unchanged, but businesses must now consider how the pandemic's progress, strength or recurrence in different geographies is impacting their recovery strategies by course correcting, again and again, as circumstances change abruptly and dramatically. This requires them to reassess assumptions, re-evaluate scenarios and strengthen their ability to sense and respond.


Professor Nripendra Singh from Clarion University, Pennsylvania made his insightful observation on the consumer facing industries in United States and ways adopted by them remain steadfast in their growth amidst a recessionary economy and conservative mindset by the consumers. As coronavirus infections spread throughout America, the USC Center for Risk and Economic Analysis of Terrorism Events (CREATE) study projects that the country stands to lose \$3 trillion to \$4 trillion in GDP over the next two years. The economic impact of the COVID-19 pandemic in the United States has been largely disruptive, adversely affecting travel, financial markets, employment, shipping, and other industries. Leading his discussion through a case study of Walmart in United States, Professor Nripendra Singh espoused a more consumer centricity to win over a growing breed of home bound consumers.

The morning session ends with a Vote of Thanks proposed by Professor Pooja Goswami to the esteemed dignitaries.




### Secondary section Hindi Activity


Examinations for Second and Third year BCA as well as BBA affiliated to Tilak Maharashtra Vidyapeeth were conducted online in the month of January.






### ISO Audit – 15th January, 2021

We follow the syllabus of Trinity College of London (Music) for western Instrument like, Guitar, Keyboard, Drum and Octapad. NSMA plays the right role in the determining the quality of music students. Realizing the demand we have added two new instrumental courses FLUTE and SITAR. NSMA also carries out research in Hindustani Music in order to restore some of undocumented works by the maestros.

### **OUR ACTIVITIES:**

Although we know the current covid-19 second wave is becoming very dangerous, we have been handling this extreme situation with patience and with the help of technology. Our teachers are coming to the campus regularly and imparting training through online platform. At present the third online session in progress. We have created three separate syllabus named Basic, Advanced and Advanced 2 online courses. Each syllabus comprises of a total 24 lectures in three months. In all, our number of

As opposed to an epidemic, which affects a large number of people across a community or population, or region, a pandemic is across countries. The COVID-19 pandemic has been described as the biggest global pandemic spreading across the entire world and has affected countries and populations and individuals in several ways. The pandemic also changed the world economy drastically. Unemployment rates have increased and many people have also seen cuts in salary. This has had a direct impact on the various industrial and social sectors including the education sector which is vital for ensuring a better present and future for the entire world.

While the year 2020 was certainly one of the most terrible years for all in recent decades, and possibly the worst year for the world after World War II, 2021 promises to be a better year, and the most important reason is that various COVID-19 vaccines have come up. Increased vaccination and more testing in months to come is likely to be the key to defeating this dreaded pandemic.

COVID-19 has posed various challenges for different sectors. In this article, I propose to have a look at the challenges faced by the education sector. I will analyse the challenges from four points of view, the management, the teachers, the students, and the parents. All are important stakeholders who have been affected severely. This

is a huge topic and it is certainly not possible to address all the issues in just one article. However, I will certainly try to touch upon the major issues involved.

## Challenges for Management;

In 2020, schools and colleges came to a grinding halt throughout the world. In the initial days of the Pandemic, there was a need for bigger buildings for temporary COVID centers since the medical infrastructure was not yet equipped to face this gigantic human and medical problem. Hence schools and colleges had mostly been taken over, for contrasting and different periods of time. Later, the challenges of disinfecting and proper cleaning had to be addressed to make the schools and colleges fit again to become educational institutions.

Recently, some educational institutions have slowly started functioning again. They needed to be intensively cleaned once again and rules for physical and social distancing laid down clearly and unambiguously. Management also has to deal with staff shortages, rotation of staff/faculty, and other similar issues. A major problem is that unlike other issues/problems of the past, COVID-19 is something totally new and there are no precedents and no guides for management who have to take decisions, some of which have to be

tough, on their own without any helping hints from the past.

The final point I would like to state is the issues of fees. This is a ticklish issue for management since while costs have increased, they do not have the liberty of passing on the costs to the students and their parents. There is also the challenge of imparting quality education online rather than offline or in-person. Parents and students also objected to paying the same amount of fees for online coaching which they had been ready to do so for classroom coaching. It became a challenge for management to assure them that their future was safe and would not be compromised adversely.

### Challenges for Teachers

Teachers have to face the challenge of teaching online. This was not something they were totally used to. In many cases, they had to first teach themselves how to handle various tools such as zoom or Webex, or google meet and then try and teach the students through such tools. Teachers also face challenges such as poor network, either from their side or from the side of the students. One peculiar problem is that the teachers often have to ask the students to mute themselves and to switch the camera off. Unfortunately, in such a situation, they really will not be able to know, which student is actually listening to them and frankly speaking, which student has initially logged on and then gone back to sleep or is doing something else such as watching Netflix or playing video games while being technically, logged on to the class with rest of the students.

What do they have to do? The only solution seems to ask random and sudden questions to different students and check whether they are being attentive. Students will also have to be patiently told that if they are deliberately sleeping, playing video games, etc then the loss will primarily be theirs only. Maybe a collaborative approach with parents can also help as well in ensuring proper participation by students.

### Challenges for Parents

Every parent wants their children to do well and most parents are happiest when their children outshine them and have a better career than them. COVID-19 issues caused huge stress in parents. Their children could be in other cities or even in other countries and every different place has its own pandemic issues and parents felt so helpless that being in a different place they could not do anything for their children.

Even if they are in the same place and house, parents had to face tremendous stress since they could see that children were sometimes losing interest in online teaching. Many parents had to face financial difficulty as well as regards payment of fees, extra costs incurred for the purchase of gadgets and installation of wifi, etc for their kids to attend online classes. One more challenge for parents was channelizing the hyper energy of active kids who were stuck at home.

Every challenge is unique in itself and requires its own solution which will vary from parent to parent and child to child.

## Challenges for Students

Last but not the least, we come to challenges for students. The year has been extremely distressing for them. Once again, the challenge has been different for children of different classes and even in the same category as well. For instance, the hardest hit obviously were those in crucial classes 10 and 12, and then school children in class 9 and 11 as well since these are feeder years for the more important subsequent year. An important aspect was that middle school, senior

school, and university children are better equipped and more cognitively developed to rationalize e-classrooms, the same is not true for younger children. At a younger age, learning is a lot through playing and through actual peer interactions. This unfortunately was not possible. Further, one also does not know whether more use of gadgets at a younger age will be helpful. Probably not, rather an actual book reading would be more advisable. However, since there was no choice, the role of parents, teachers, and older siblings becomes very important to ensure that gadgets are correctly used.

The most important challenge for students of course was paying attention. Frankly, one cannot blame them. It is not easy to have the same focus and concentration for online coaching as it is towards classroom coaching, especially for several hours a day.

However, as is with all challenges, they can be met and met successfully. It is seen that during exams, students go through a lot of pressure, including peer pressure, even if they portray themselves as cool, calm, and collected. This pressure reduced significantly. Students got more time for themselves and to look after their health, including mental health. This made them more productive, even if not related to academics. Students also got more time for on-line competitions and MUNS etc ( Mock United Nations competition). It overall helped children to destress and be happier as workload reduced significantly.

### Conclusion

What is ahead? It is expected that slowly and steadily, classroom teaching will restart. Initially, norms of physical distancing are likely to be there, which will mean that teachers may need to do multiple shifts and teach the same things two or three times to students of the same class. Possibly, transport such as school buses may not start for some time, which will mean that parents and children will have to make their own arrangements to reach school and go back home. There could be a new hybrid system of teaching, which will be partly online and partly classroom teaching. This would be a challenge for the management to come up with such a system that will be acceptable to all stakeholders and also ensure that the primary goal of effective teaching is met.

I am sure of one thing. The challenges will be successfully met and students who are our future will make the world a better place.




